FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

February 5, 2023

Last Saturday (January 28), the ministers and I had the privilege of spending several hours with the elders for the purpose of studying and talking about Kingdom business here at Kingwood. As Carl mentioned last Sunday, many of you have expressed your desire for more reflection and focus on communion, as well as some things you think might be needed in the area of worship. Last week's communion might have seemed a little awkward at times because it was different. We had our communion thoughts followed by more reflective singing, and so on. Most importantly, remember why we are doing it. When Covid hit, and we stopped passing trays, it unintentionally created a time in worship that was of shorter focus. While we are not going to pass trays right now, we will continue to look for ways to put an emphasis on one of the very important things we do each week. Communion was at the heart of what the early church did. It was of great importance and we want to give it that importance as well. I encourage you to reflect in whatever way you want to reflect during this time of communion. Make it unique to you and remember the great sacrifice we are celebrating when we commune together.
