FROM THE PREACHER'S DESK

September 25, 2022

As was announced last week by Adam, the elders are looking for a few additional deacons to appoint here at Kingwood. Today, we will focus our message on Acts 6, where men were selected to take care of a need that had risen in the early church. Many believe this is the first selection of deacons, although the word doesn't appear in the text. Later in scripture, Paul addresses Timothy and gives him the qualifications for deacons. In our lesson today, we will look at those qualifications as well. On the back of the bulletin today, there is a QR code that will take you to the nomination form. There will be some printed copies at the Welcome Center today and an email will be sent, with the QR code, later today or tomorrow. We ask that you pray over these qualifications and the men that you might nominate for consideration and then fill the form out no later than two weeks from today, October 9. The elders are especially looking to add deacons in the building and grounds, involvement, children's, and senior ministries. Please be very prayerful about your nominations and I look forward to seeing how God works in this process.

It is hard to believe we are reaching the end of September. Before you know it, we will be enjoying our Trunk of Treats, helping families at Thanksgiving and Christmas, and enjoying the holidays with those we love. My preaching plan will be to finish up our look at the book of Acts by early December. Obviously, there will be parts of the book (some of Paul's journeys) that we highlight instead of diving deeper into. My focus on this book is to show us the history of the early church and encourage us to be the church God called us to be. I appreciate your comments on the series so far. Following our discussion today of deacons, David will dive into chapter 8 next week.
